Montauk Yacht Club Shows Love To Hampton Locals With Savings All Season Long

The [Montauk Yacht Club Resort & Marina](#) reaches out to the local community with a 10% discount on food and beverage purchases at Gulf Coast Kitchen by Robbin Haas, Hurricane Alley, and Barracuda Bar and Turtle Lounge for the entire 2010 season.



Locals residing on the South Fork, from Westhampton Beach to Montauk including Shelter Island, may register to receive a savings card when they dine before Memorial

Day. The resort will then deliver cards to the diner's home via mail. The savings card may also be applied to lodging and spa purchases.

At Gulf Coast Kitchen by Robbin Haas, Chef Haas shapes the menu (\$8-\$42) of New American fare based on what is locally, raised, caught or grown. Guests may start their meal with tuna tartar, soy, ginger, cucumber, wakame and coconut; or cream or tomato clam chowder. Main courses offerings feature: seared diver scallops, fava beans, marinated lemons and herb oil; sauteed Montauk fluke, wilted spinach, brown butter and toasted hazelnuts; and hand cut rigatoni with slow roasted beef and mushrooms. Desserts make a sweet ending with deep chocolate pots de creme; warm apple tart tatin with vanilla gelato and ginger caramel; and sorbets and gelatos accompanied by homemade cookies.

Hurricane Alley offers fresh home-style cooking for breakfast (\$6-\$21) and in an all-day lunch and dinner menu (\$8-\$24). Diners may dig into full breakfasts with eggs any style but also with fresh lobster or crab cakes. Lunch and dinner selections include lobster roll, tuna sliders and griddled calamari. There is grilled cheese with fontina, grilled eggplant, peppers, avocado and zucchini; fresh mozzarella buratta with tomatoes, basil and marinated mushrooms; goat cheese gnocchi served in a light tomato-basil broth; and a new pizza oven that churns out individual pies.

Sip and snack at the pentagonal Barracuda Bar with water views, on the yachtside patio or inside the "other" Montauk Lighthouse, the replica of the landmark beacon built by Carl Fisher in the 1920s, named the Turtle Lounge. Choose from a selection of handcrafted specialty and classic cocktails (\$10-\$18) such as "The Club" Margarita rimmed with Habanero salt; Cucumber lemonade made with Crop Organic cucumber vodka; "The Perfect Storm" of vodka and ginger beer; and the chocolate raspberry martini.
