

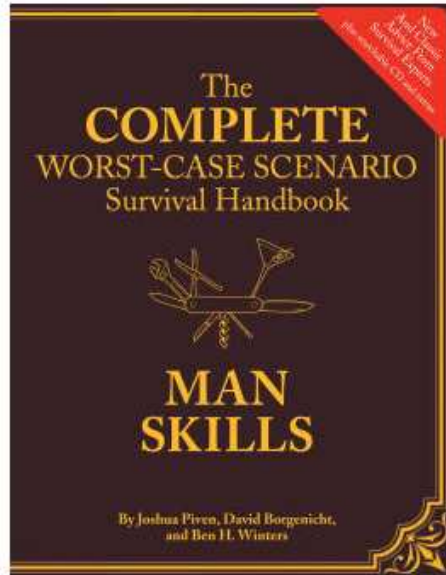

## GET TO THE CLUB

An excellent margarita calls for excellent silver tequila (blanco or silver tequila is unaged, but boldly flavored). We turn to Milagro Silver, a triple-distilled, small-batch tequila that is a favorite of bartenders for its smooth flavor and crisp taste. Jaime Salas, mixologist for Milagro, shared with us this margarita recipe, made for swanky Montauk Yacht Club in The Hamptons.

### The Club Margarita

½ fresh lime muddled

¾ ounces ginger cilantro syrup

2½ ounces Milagro Silver Tequila

¾ ounce Cointreau

Pinch habanero salt

Rim glass with habanero salt (or bar salt) and fill with ice. Shake cocktail and pour into glass.

Note: You can make syrup by infusing simple syrup with fresh ginger and cilantro. Or use your favorite simple syrup or agave nectar. Milagro Silver Tequila sells for about \$25.
